

## Weekly Outlook: Rainfall: 17 to 23 April 2018




Figure 1: Expected precipitation 17 to 23 April 2018.

Good news for Cape Town is that two cold fronts are expected to bring rain to the region - up to 20mm - this week. Isolated areas over the Free State can also expect some rainfall. The most significant rainfall however, is expected along the northern coast of the Eastern Cape as well as a large part of the southern and central KwaZulu-Natal coastal areas. As we move towards the winter, less rain is expected over the summer rainfall region.

## Average Minimum Temperatures: 17 to 23 April 2018




Figure 2: Average Minimum Temperatures 17 to 23 April 2018.

## Average Maximum Temperatures: 17 to 23 April 2018




Figure 3: Average Maximum Temperatures 17 to 23 April 2018.
