

Weekly Outlook: Rainfall: 29 May to 4 June 2018




Figure 1: Expected precipitation 29 May to 4 June 2018.

Two new cold fronts are expected to bring some welcome rain to the Western Cape this week - up to 30 mm expected is in some areas. The cold fronts also will bring rainfall to the eastern coastal areas of the Eastern Cape, and light rain is also expected over the Free State, KwaZulu-Natal and Mpumalanga. Snow is furthermore expected over the Drakensberg mountains on Tuesday and Thursday.

Average Minimum Temperatures: 29 May to 4 June 2018




Figure 2: Average Minimum Temperatures 29 May to 4 June 2018.

Snowfalls over the Drakensberg mountains will cause the minimum temperature to drop to below 10°C for most parts of South Africa.

Average Maximum Temperatures: 29 May to 4 June 2018




Figure 3: Average Maximum Temperatures 29 May to 4 June 2018.

Temperatures above 20°C are expected for the northern parts of South Africa. Cooler maximum temperatures, below 20°C are expected for the southern regions of South Africa.
